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Introduction to GUIDE

The purpose of this GUIDE is to assist local CTE Directors in:

understanding the licensing options available to Career and Technical Education educators,

- understanding how to assist educators in adding licensure areas,
- understanding which courses may be taught with each license.

CTE educators, like all educators, follow licensing requirements approved by the NC State Board of Education in policy <u>LICN-001</u>. CTE educators may be eligible for an Initial Professional License by:

- graduating a teacher education program, OR
- qualifying for a CTE Restricted License (DPI Licensure refers to this as a provisional CTE license; program code 35;), OR
- If they hold a bachelor's degree, CTE educators may also be eligible for a residency license.

Requirements for educators entering the profession by qualifying for an Initial Professional License in CTE Restricted License areas are different from residency. Major differences are the requirement of related work experience and related degree as well as the acceptance of associate degrees and high school diplomas in some CTE license areas. The CTE Licensure Policies and Procedures Manual referenced in CTED-004 details licensure policy for CTE Restricted License areas. LICN-001 allows potential educators to enter the profession by qualifying for a Residency License. The Residency section of this guide provides guidance on qualifying candidates for Residency licenses in CTE areas.

Some courses require specific industry credentials. In this GUIDE, there are sections on each license listing each course and required/suggested credentials or training. Refer to the GUIDE each year for updates that will be effective in July to ensure the most recent information is being used to assess qualifications for licensure in CTE areas.

CTE Teacher Education/Licensing Programs

North Carolina public and private universities have teacher education programs in some CTE areas. Some also offer licensing programs in CTE areas. NCDPI's Educator Effectiveness Division provides a list of schools with approved teacher education programs. See the grid below for CTE programs and licenses available in approved EPPs. Residency Licenses for CTE

Per <u>LICN-001</u>, an individual may be issued a one-year Residency License in a teaching area, with the option to renew twice within no longer than a 3-year period, if the individual meets all of the following requirements:

- (1) holds a minimum of a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education
- (2) has either completed 24 hours of coursework in the requested licensure area or passed the NCSBE-approved content area examination(s) for the requested licensure area;
- (3) is enrolled in a recognized educator preparation program (EPP), and;
- (4) meets all other requirements established by the NCSBE including completing preservice requirements prior to teaching.

<u>TCED-009</u> lists the EPP admission requirements which include a 2.7 GPA. The EPP must maintain a cohort average of 3.0 in order to maintain their status as an approved EPP. The EPP makes the decision to admit candidates to their approved licensure programs. A candidate with a GPA below 2.7 may have difficulty being admitted to an EPP.

If an individual fails to renew the Residency License for either the second or third year, the current Residency License will expire. Within three years of the effective date of the original Residency License, a Residency License may be reinstated at the request of an LEA if the following conditions are met: (1) The individual taught at least six calendar months during the year when he/she last held an active Residency License, and; (2) The individual is enrolled with an EPP, and; (3) The individual is employed as a teacher in an LEA.

CTE Restricted Licenses

CTE Restricted Licenses (program code 35) allow candidates to obtain an Initial Professional Educator license based primarily on the candidate's work experience. To qualify for an initial professional license via the CTE Restricted route, the candidate must meet the degree requirements and work experience requirements. Additionally, in some cases, credentials are required prior to teaching. Initial Professional Licenses obtained through the CTE Restricted License route result in a restricted Continuing Professional License. The license may add other CTE license areas, provided they are at the same academic level, but may <u>not</u> add areas outside of CTE. Under NC State Board of Education policy <u>CTED-004</u>, the CTE Licensure Policies and Procedures Manual is policy. The manual provides detailed information for the CTE Restricted route such as:

- required degree level,
- examples of related degrees,
- examples of related work experience,
- number of years of work experience required for the CTE Restricted route,
- semester hours required for the license noting both required and elective courses,
- credentials required prior to teaching or before the expiration of the Initial Professional License and core academic competence requirements for educators pursuing licensure with a high school diploma,
- requirement of NCDPI Sponsored New Teacher Induction for this route.

Temporary Licenses

<u>LICN-001</u> allows LEAs to issue a **Permit to Teach** for a teaching assignment at the A-00 pay level to persons who hold at least a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institute of higher education, **have less than 18 hours in the subject area**, but who do not qualify for a license under any other approach. The permit to teach shall be valid for one year and may not be renewed. When an LEA requests a Permit to Teach, the LEA must document that no appropriately licensed professionals or persons who are eligible for a residency or lateral entry license are available to accept the position.

NCDPI may issue **Emergency Licenses** for a teaching assignment at the request of the LEA or charter school. The Emergency License is a one-year nonrenewable license issued to an individual who: 1) holds a bachelor's degree with 18 hours of coursework relevant to the requested licensure area but has not completed a recognized educator preparation program, and; 2) does not qualify for a Residency License. Applicants for an Emergency License shall meet all other requirements established by the NCSBE, including preservice training, prior to teaching. Emergency licenses qualify for pay based on related work experience.

Before requesting a Permit to Teach or an Emergency License, LEAs should also explore the CTE Restricted Route for licensing in CTE areas.

Reciprocity for Out of State Teacher Licenses

<u>LICN-001</u> provides policy on issuing North Carolina licenses to educators who hold a license in another state.

Out of state applicants who meet all of the following criteria may be issued a Continuing Professional License:

- are fully licensed in another state, and;
- have three or more years of experience in another state and have met comparable testing requirements in another state; **or**,
- have National Board Certification.

Individuals who hold an out-of-state teaching license or have completed an out-of-state educator preparation program and have <u>fewer than three years</u> of teaching experience may be granted an **Initial Professional License** if the following criteria are met:

- Successfully passed another state's comparable licensure exam (must meet or exceed the test developer's recommended passing score at the time the exam was taken); or,
- Attempt the NC required licensure exam in the first year of teaching and pass the exam before or during the second year of teaching. (See LICN-003)

Eligibility for Pay for Experience

The NC Public Schools Salary Manual referenced in <u>SLRY-000</u> provides all salary eligibility rules. Salary for experience credit is subject to the level of education the teacher has completed. DPI recognizes one year for every year for a bachelor's degree; one year for every year minus two for an associate degree only; and one year for every year minus four for a high school diploma only.

All related work experience for pay purposes should be documented on DPI's Form NE Verification of Non-teaching Experience. (PDF version/Word version)

Public Safety/Fire Fighter Instructors should include the name of the fire station, dates of employment, 40+ hours per week due to the 24/7 on call nature of the work recognized by the NC Office of the State Fire Marshall (NC OSFM), and the signature of the fire chief on the Form NE. If serving multiple fire stations, dates may not overlap. Do not use the word "volunteer" on any documentation. NC OSFM recognizes all fire fighter service as credible work experience.

National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) pay is not guaranteed for CTE Support Service Licenses. SPCs **DO NOT** qualify for NBPTS pay from state funds. CDCs with provisional licenses DO NOT qualify for NBPTS pay from state funds but can receive it when the provisional status is cleared. LEAs may consider using local funds to replace the NBPTS pay differential.

Adding a CTE License to a Continuing Professional License

CTED-004 provides options for adding a CTE area to a Continuing Professional License.

- Any educator with a Continuing Professional License may add a CTE area however, educators with
 restricted continuing professional licenses in a CTE area, may add another CTE area if they hold the
 required degree level for the additional area.
- All requirements must be met before submitting the application to add the new area to the current license.
 Any one of the options below serves as sufficient evidence to add an area to a current Continuing
 Professional License:
 - 1) completing an NCSBE approved educator preparation program in the additional area; OR
 - 2) satisfying NCSBE approved testing requirements in the additional area; OR
 - 3) completing 24 semester hours in the subject area with a grade of "C" or better in each course; OR
 - 4) earning industry credentials required for the eligible license (see licenses eligible for add on via this option in table below); OR
 - 5) meeting eligibility criteria and completing requirements for the CTE Support Services license areas

Provisional Licenses in CTE Areas

Educators with an Initial Professional License or a Continuing Professional License, restricted or non-restricted, are eligible to add an area provisionally if assigned in the area AND if they hold the required degree level for the provisional area as described in CTED-004. The LEA must request the provisional license area. Educators have up to five years from the first effective date of the provisional license to complete requirements and clear the provisional status. A request to extend the provisional license area must be submitted annually via the NCDPI Licensure Online System. If action is not taken annually to either extend, remove, or clear the provisional area, the entire license expires.

Educators may choose one of the options below to add a provisional area:

- 1) completing an NCSBE approved educator preparation program in the additional area; OR
- 2) satisfying NCSBE approved testing requirements in the additional area; OR
- 3) completing 24 semester hours in the subject area with a grade of "C" or better in each course; OR
- 4) earning industry credentials required for the eligible license (see table in Adding an Additional Area section of this GUIDE); OR
- 5) meeting eligibility criteria and completing requirements for the CTE Support Services license areas

The CTE license areas listed in the table below are **NOT eligible** for provisional status due to student and educator safety concerns. These can be added as an additional area to a current license prior to teaching.

Renewing a Continuing Professional License

<u>LICN-005</u> establishes rules for renewing a Continuing Professional License. LEAs may have additional criteria for renewal as well. For licenses expiring on or after June 30, 2019, teachers of grades six through twelve must complete 8.0 renewal credits during each five-year renewal cycle that meet the following requirements:

- a) 3 renewal credits in their academic subject areas (aligned to Standard 3 or 4)
- b) 2 renewal credits addressing the Digital Learning Competencies
- c) 3 general credits (not to include years of experience) at the discretion of the employing LEA. LEAs reserve the right to assign literacy requirements for any educator.

See <u>LICN-005</u> for additional details on renewal including options for completing National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, administrator and student services renewal rules, and renewal for retired personnel.

Licenses Per Course

To determine which license is required for each course, consult the License In-Field-Subject-EC Crosswalk published annually by NCDPI's Home Base and housed at www.nc-sis.or/courses.html. This document, available in spreadsheet format and can be easily sorted by course or license. The document will list each course multiple times



and each license, <u>retired and active</u>, that are eligible to teach the course. Many teachers have continuing professional licenses or endorsements in areas that have been retired. These are still renewable for those who hold them. The crosswalk lists all licenses and endorsements eligible to teach each course. It also lists a description of the license and grade levels the license supports. This document is especially

useful in ensuring compliance. Keep in mind, that some courses require specific training and/or credentials in addition to the educator license. For example, the Public Safety license, 74099 is very broad and is the appropriate license for many courses. If teaching the Fire Fighter Technology courses, the educator is also required to be a licensed Fire Fighter Instructor as authorized by the NC Office of the State Fire Marshall. NCDPI Licensure would issue the 74099 license if the educator had one of the required credentials as noted in the CTE Licensure Policies and Procedures Manual; however, the LEA must ensure that the educator also has the required credential/training for a specific course. In some cases, the outside agency can restrict access to curriculum if training is not completed and/or credentials not obtained.

CTE Licenses, Route Options, & Requirements

In this section, each currently issued CTE License is listed, along with available route options, courses eligible to be taught with this license, and credentials and training that may be helpful in hiring and/or ensuring best practices. Note that bachelor's degree level CTE licenses can be obtained through both residency and restricted routes, however associate degree and high school diploma level licenses may only pursue a CTE Restricted license. The route determines the criteria for eligibility in hiring as addressed in the previous Residency for CTE, and CTE Restricted Licenses sections.

Program requirements for candidates pursuing a residency license are defined by the educator preparation program recommending the candidate for licensure. Questions regarding program requirements should be directed to the EPP. Program requirements for candidates utilizing the CTE restricted route are listed in the CTE Licensure Policies and Procedures Manual and should be monitored by the Regional Alternative Licensing Center, https://ralc.us.
