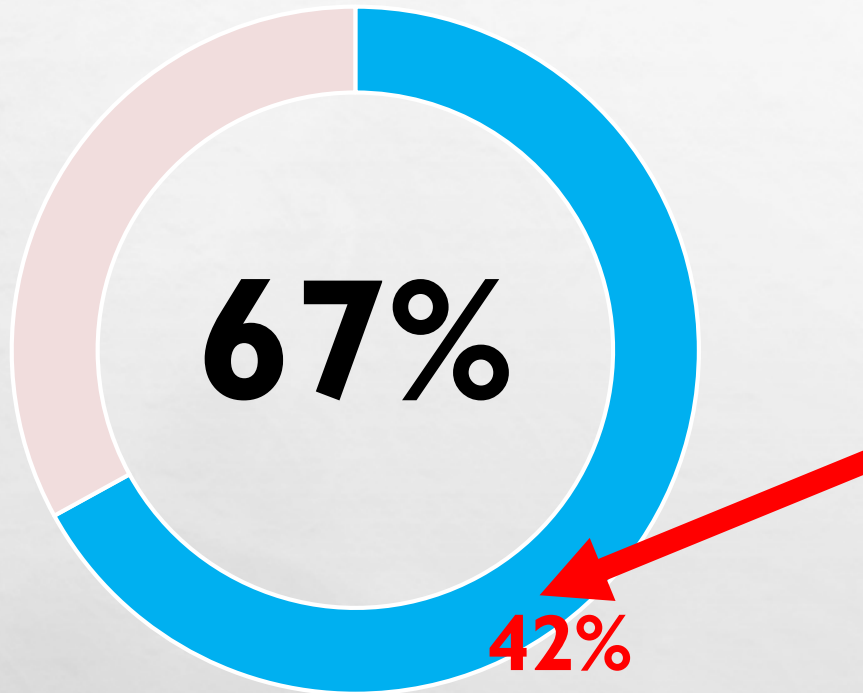


OUR URGENCY

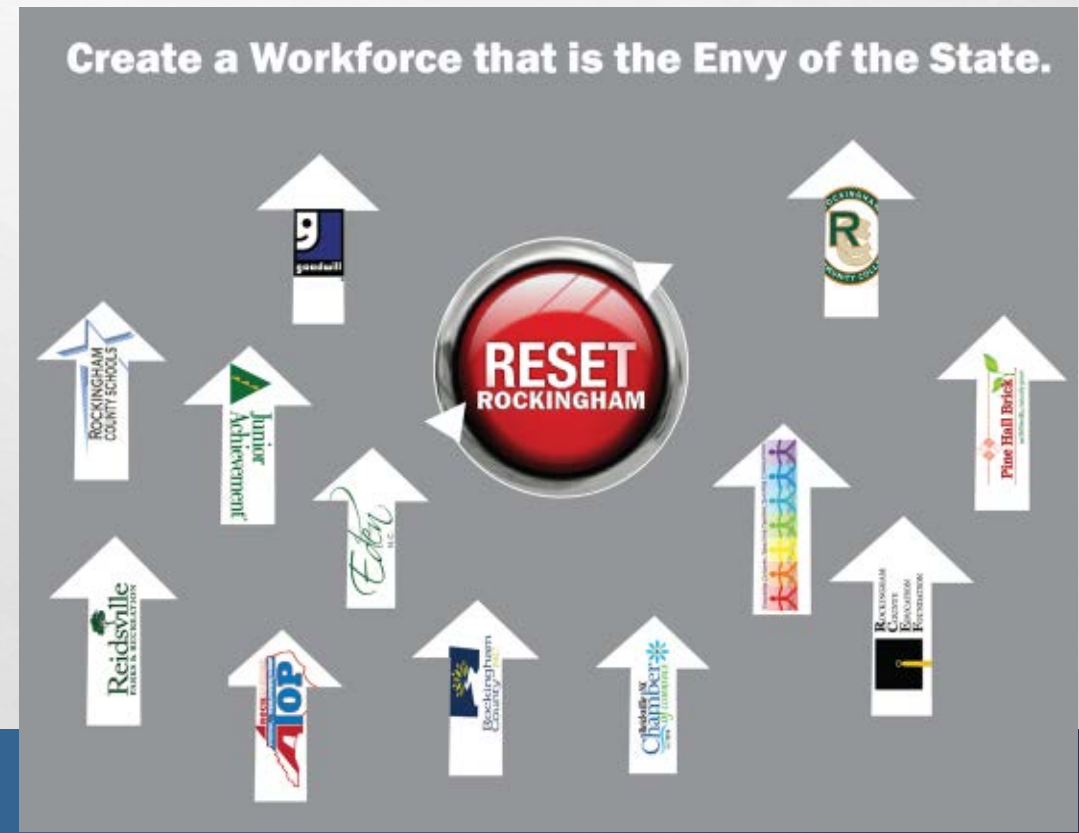

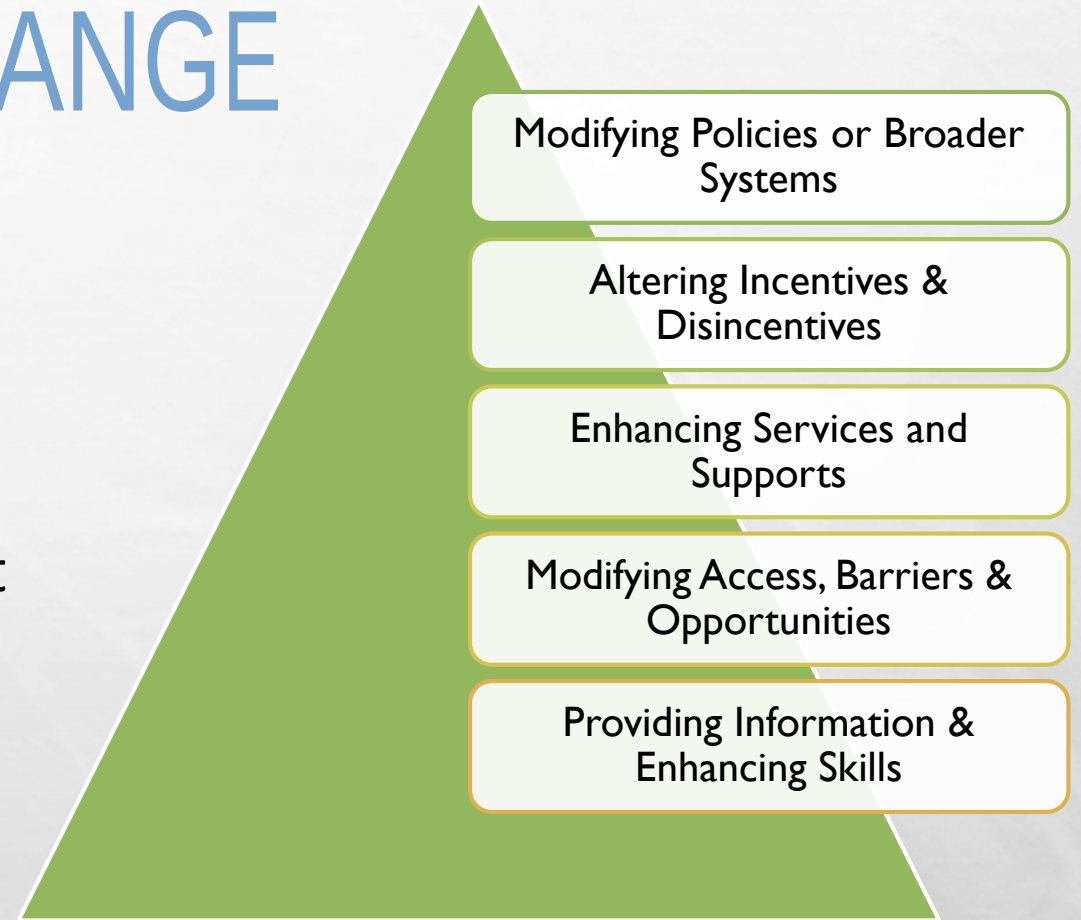

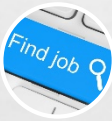
COMMUNITY ACCOMPLISHMENTS
